BACKGROUND

Philosophy

The Ealy Center for Natural Healing is a training and healing center for practitioners who wish to assist others in the ancient tradition of bringing about total healing for the whole person. Healing occurs when the full self of an individual participates in that healing. Ealy-trained practitioners facilitate this type of healing by: using techniques that restore the natural flow of Chi to both the physical body and the energy field around the body; bringing conscious awareness to the healing process; and educating clients in methods they can use to continue their own healing. The primary modality taught at the Ealy Center is Physiohelanics™, natural healing for the whole person. Only practitioners certified by The Ealy Center for Natural Healing are permitted to use Physiohelanics techniques and to refer to themselves as Physiohelanics practitioners.

All Physiohelanics practitioners embrace the philosophy that they are guided by their Higher Self during healing sessions. They believe in the sacredness of healing work while adhering to a strict code of ethics. They are continually engaged in their own personal growth and healing process. Physiohelanics healers hold a deep respect for the intimate connection that occurs when an energy healer works with another person's energy to facilitate total well-being.

Physiohelanics healing requires that the practitioner be in excellent mental and physical health. It is a modality that feeds the soul, not the ego. Students are expected to be committed to their personal as well as professional growth.

Values

- Our primary mission is to train individuals who are called to fully realize their potential as healers using Physiohelanics™, natural healing for the whole person.
- We are devoted to serving the energetic needs of our clients and students.
- As practitioners, we are committed to maintaining our total health and well-being so we can serve our clients.
- We embrace the Divine energetic abundance of the Universe and of Mother Earth and channel this healing energy during sessions.
- We understand that financial abundance is part of the energetic abundance of Earth and our Universe and we embrace this abundance so we can continue serving clients and students.
- We believe our healing work is sacred and guided by the Higher Self of the client and of the practitioner.

- We hold a deep respect for the trust our students and clients place in us and understand that we are all intricately interconnected.
- The healing modality taught at The Ealy Center, Physiohelanics™, is our contribution to world peace through the extension of the inner peace embraced by practitioners and nurtured in clients.

History

In the mid 1970s, C Diane Ealy began her explorations into energy healing. She studied with several well-known healers and read abundantly. At the same time, she was training to become a psychotherapist and working on her doctorate in behavioral science. She completed her degree in 1980 and continued her studies and practice of energy healing. Dr. Ealy began developing an energy modality that would address all four aspects of an individual simultaneously: spiritual, intellectual, physical, and emotional. She believed that an individual's total well-being could be best served by a healing approach that would facilitate the unified growth of the entire being in a gentle, safe way.

By the end of the 1980s, Dr. Ealy had developed Physiohelanics™, an all-encompassing energy healing modality that addresses the total being. She has been providing these treatments to her clients for over nineteen years. In 2002 she was approached by several individuals who wanted to become Physiohelanics practitioners. In response to their requests for in-depth training, she formed The Ealy Center for Natural Healing, LLC, in 2003.

Facility

The Ealy Center for Natural Healing, LLC is located at 5210 East Pima Street, Suite 110 in Tucson, Arizona. This quiet, central location is easily accessible from all parts of the city. All students contribute to developing and maintaining a peaceful, clear energetic environment within and around the facility.

EDUCATIONAL PROGRAM

Physiohelanics™ Certification Program

The Ealy Center for Natural Healing, LLC, was formed to provide a central location for spreading the unique healing modality, Physiohelanics, into the world. The Ealy Center is currently the only place where an individual can earn a certificate in Physiohelanics healing. This modality is leading the way in understanding and facilitating human energetic evolution and transformation. As such, it has the potential for being a major building block of world peace. Our belief is that world peace will happen through the increasing numbers of individuals who live their lives as an extension of their inner peace. Physiohelanics practitioners must be at peace during a treatment while clients who experience the treatment gain a full sense of inner tranquility as a result of the treatment.

Personal and Professional Standards

Because Physiohelanics is designed to address all aspects of the human psyche, practitioners must be keenly aware of their own issues and be willing to clear those issues as much as is humanly possible. Physiohelanics Master Practitioners devote twelve months of part-time study to learning specific healing techniques, deepening their healing skills, and pursuing their personal growth.

Employment Opportunities

Currently, most graduates pursue a private practice at a starting rate of \$60 to \$70 per hour. However, as energy healing and energy medicine are more widely accepted, employment possibilities will open up in spas and resorts as well as treatment centers of all types. Since there are no state or national standards for energy healers, a discerning public will increasingly look for healers who are certified and who have completed a program with high standards and a supervised practicum.

Objectives

Our intention is to guide individuals who feel called to develop, enhance, or deepen their healing skills. The Master Practitioner program is designed for individuals who wish to pursue a private practice or employment as a Physiohelanics Healer. We are developing people who have an increasing awareness of and a devotion to their personal growth along with a deep respect for the power of energy healing. In alignment with these intentions, we are guided by the following objectives:

The Ealy Center for Natural Healing graduates

1. Understand and know how to stay aligned with the Divine Universal and Earth energy that is used during a Physiohelanics treatment;
2. Respect and follow our established Code of Ethics;
3. Possess highly-attuned skills for energy healing;
4. Know their limitations as individual healers;

5. Allow themselves to be guided by their client's and their Higher Selves during a treatment;
6. Have the confidence and clarity in themselves to follow the guidance from the client's Higher Self;
7. Respect the power of energy healing and the intimate relationship a Physiohelanics treatment creates between client and healer;
8. Are able to listen compassionately and communicate effectively with the client and any guides and totems who are present during the healing session;
9. Create a safe and peaceful sacred space for the healing session.

Structure

The Master Practitioner program is conducted using a holistic approach. Because every aspect of the human energy system affects every other aspect, this approach is in keeping with the nature of the modality being studied. For example, an eight contact hour course may be taught over two or three class meetings with general principles and applications of Physiohelanics making up the remaining eight hours of class time. The required contact hours are met within the larger context of becoming a Physiohelanics healer. Each subject studied requires a written paper (or, when studying how to construct casenotes, actual casenotes the students have created from treating clients). This holistic approach offers several benefits:

- Weaving all topics into a functioning whole picture,
- Reinforcing the interconnectedness of all subjects studied,
- Gaining practical applications for the holistic nature of Physiohelanics energy healing,
- Allowing time between discussions of a lengthy topic for students to take in the information, make it theirs, strengthen this learning by applying their new knowledge between class sessions, then deepening the material in subsequent class discussions.

Curriculum Overview

The Master Practitioner program is designed for working adults who are able to attend classes part-time. All classes are a combination of on-line and on-site study. These classes are designed for self-motivated individuals who can devote themselves to a year of intense study, partly on-line and partly in residence. This schedule provides adequate time for students to accumulate the 200 practicum hours at a pace equal to accrued classroom hours. All classes are required although the challenge option exists. Each class requires a paper or other demonstration of learning specifying what the student learned, how she or he is applying this learning, and how this knowledge has changed her or him. Additional course work may be required to meet specific student needs. As a final project, Master Practitioner students present a demonstration of excellence of their design that weaves all their classroom and experiential learning into a visible whole.

Course Descriptions

The Ealy Center for Natural Healing, LLC Physiohelanics Master Practitioner Certification

Applied Physiohelanics Techniques

120 credit hours

The student will learn the multiple energy structures within the etheric and physical bodies addressed during a Physiohelanics treatment. She or he will be able to locate and correct any abnormalities in these structures. She or he will learn to facilitate deep levels of healing within an individual, working simultaneously with the spiritual, intellectual, emotional, and physical aspects of each client. The student will be able to make energy-related recommendations to clients for over-all improvements in health and well-being. The student will learn to avoid going beyond her or his capabilities in healing others and to refer to another professional when appropriate. Healing techniques include both in-person and distance healing. Class includes practicum supervision.

200 Practicum Hours

The student will complete 200 healing sessions using Physiohelanics techniques. Student will complete case notes on each session and will discuss a representative sample of these sessions in the Applied Physiohelanics Techniques class.

Channeling Energy

8 credit hours

The student will learn how to channel and direct healing energy, including protecting oneself from the negativity of others, intentionally extracting blocked and negatively charged energies from a client, and using various colors of energy as appropriate.

Ethics of Energy Healing

8 credit hours

The student will explore Physiohelanics ethical standards as well as those found in other therapeutic professions and understand the purpose for these principles in Physiohelanics healing. The student will agree to abide by these ethical standards during and after training. Required text: *The Ethics of Touch*.

Creating and Maintaining Case Files

4 credit hours

The student will learn how to assemble and maintain case files on each client, including the content and structure of case notes, intake and release forms.

Fundamental Understanding of Human Anatomy

4 credit hours

The student will have basic knowledge of anatomy and will have ready references available when working with clients. Required: *Anatomy Bar Chart*.

Developing and Trusting Kinesthetic Intuition**8 credit hours**

The student will understand and be able to use her or his kinesthetic intuition during a Physiohelanics treatment. She or he will learn methods for continuously developing and trusting the kinesthetic intuition.

Communication Skills**8 credit hours**

The student will learn communication techniques including listening skills to be applied during treatment sessions. Interpersonal and intrapersonal communication skill building will be emphasized. Required text: *The Verbally Abusive Relationship*.

Working with Spirit Guides and Totems**8 credit hours**

The student will understand the function of spirit guides and totem animals during a Physiohelanics session, including the practitioner's and the client's. The student will learn how to work with her or his own guides.

Survey of Healing Modalities, Ancient and Modern**8 credit hours**

The student will report on research into at least two other healing or energy-based modalities to demonstrate a basic knowledge of other healing practices. Required text: *Vibrational Medicine*

Fundamental Understanding of Healing and Quantum Physics 8 credit hrs

The student will gain a basic understanding of the laws of quantum physics as they relate to energy healing. The student will be able to verbally explain the relevance of these laws to energy healing. Required text: *The Field*. Suggested viewing: *What The Bleep Do We Know?*

Building a Private Practice**8 credit hours**

The student will create appropriate marketing materials including a business card, brochure or flier, and press release. Other topics include: setting prices, creating an appropriate physical space, networking with other professionals, getting referrals, bookkeeping, and avoiding burnout. Required text: *Business Mastery*.

Demonstration of Excellence**8 credit hours**

The student will demonstrate her or his acquired and developed Physiohelanics healing skills in a manner approved by the student's mentor and satisfactory to the Master Practitioner level. The student will further demonstrate how the process of becoming a Master Practitioner has impacted her or him.

Class Schedule for Master Practitioner Class of 2010

This class formally begins with a conference call the evening of Wednesday , April 29, 2009. Students are expected to participate in the Physiohelanics web log and a monthly conference call, to complete class papers or projects at the rate of one per month and to attend one five-day and three four-day residency seminars in Tucson, Arizona. Class meets from 9:00 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. each day. The residency dates are as follows:

May 13 – 17, 2009*

September 10 – 13, 2009

January 14 – 17, 2010

April 15 – 18, 2010

*May 13, 2009 is set aside for students to receive a Physiohelanics treatment and/or Soul Memory Discovery field clearing. These treatments are required of all who have not received them previously. The fees for these sessions are not included in the tuition.

Students must be committed to meeting the residency requirement. Anyone who fails to do so will have to make arrangements through the Director to meet individually with the instructors, paying them at their usual hourly fee in addition to tuition. The residency seminars meet the required 120 hours of Applied Physiohelanics Techniques.

Note: Students wishing to participate in this class must have all application materials submitted to the Director by March 30, 2009. Students who plan to apply for financial aid must have their application materials submitted by March 2, 2009.

POLICIES

Grading

Our focus on learning involves a breadth and depth of applied knowledge. We respect that individuals learn in their own way while at the same time we uphold standards of learning. We do not use a traditional grading system but rather assess learning individually. All students are required to submit a paper following a prescribed format for each class. The instructor will evaluate each paper for met goals. If the student does not appear to have met the learning goals required for a class, the instructor and the student will have an in-depth discussion to reassess the situation. The student may be required to do additional study and/or rewrite the paper. The student and instructor may also mutually agree on another means for the student to present her or his newly acquired learning. This approach must have the approval of the Director.

Academic Progress

Students are required to maintain satisfactory academic progress toward their certification. In the event that a student falls short of satisfactory progress, the student, the instructor, and the Director will discuss the student's goals and how she or he plans to meet those goals. The student in this circumstance may be required to design a written learning contract, agreed to by the instructor and Director, to meet the requirements of the program within one to two months of signing the agreement.

Professional and Personal Progress

Physiohelanics energy healing is unique in its demands that the healer constantly develop more awareness of her or his personal issues as they arise. Thus, the healer's professional and personal growth are entwined. Students who encounter personal issues are expected to work through those issues, moving toward resolution. The instructor or the Director may require that a student who is having challenges with a personal issue(s) seek professional help from a psychotherapist or other appropriate professional. *Failure to engage in ones personal growth and refusal to seek professional assistance when deemed beneficial may result in suspension or dismissal from the program.*

Student Services

The Ealy Center for Natural Healing serves our students by providing a nurturing, professional environment in which each individual is free to explore and develop his or her unique healing skills and abilities. We encourage students to create informal groups for deepening learning while retaining a sense of adventure and fun regarding that learning.

Notification of Progress Challenges

Inadequate progress will be discussed between the student and instructor as soon as the instructor is aware of the issue. The instructor will make written notes of the discussion that will be signed by both the student and instructor. Copies will be kept in the student's file and will be sent to the Director. A follow-up meeting date will be agreed to. If a lack of progress is still evident at the follow-up meeting, the student will receive written notification of her or his change of status.

Change of Status

The student who is unable to maintain satisfactory academic, professional, or personal progress may change status in the following ways:

1. Taking a leave of absence from the program for up to a year; student will be granted re-entrance only with the consent of the Director
2. Withdrawing from the program permanently.

Any changes in status will be in writing with copies going to the student, into the student's file, and to the Director.

Re-enrollment

A student who withdraws from the program is eligible to apply for re-admission with the upcoming Master Practitioner program. The stated admissions policy must be followed.

Attendance

On-line class attendance is determined by the student's meeting the dates for required papers for each class, participating in monthly conference calls, and attending residency seminars. Attendance at these seminars is extremely important and can only be made up by meeting individually with the instructors, paying them at their usual hourly rate.

Thirty-two hours of missed class time, the equivalent of four papers for on-line students, during the program may be cause for dismissal from the program at the discretion of the instructor and Director. A student will be considered withdrawn from the program if he or she misses four consecutive papers.

A student enrolled in the on-line program will be considered withdrawn from the program if he or she fails to attend any one of the residency seminars without prior notification to the Director and developing a plan to make up the missed seminar in a way agreed to by the Director.

Good Standing

Students maintain good standing when the following conditions are met:

1. Tuition payments are made on time.

2. All Ealy Center for Natural Healing rules and Code of Ethics are followed.
3. Clear, two-way communication is maintained among students and between the student and the instructor and between the student and the Director.

Student Grievance Policy and Procedure

Becoming a Physiohelanics Master Practitioner requires the student to fully engage in the process of self-exploration and self-growth. This can, at times, be an intensive experience wherein challenges, conflicts, and grievances may arise. The Ealy Center for Natural Healing strives to guide students in realizing and maintaining the inner peace and harmony that is necessary for effective learning and healing. Students experiencing disturbances to this state are advised to attend to these feelings according to the procedure outlined below.

When a conflict arises and a student feels the need for assistance, she or he may approach the Director. Within two weeks of the student's request for a meeting with the Director, the Director and the student will discuss the issue. On-line students may choose an in-person or telephone meeting. If the Director cannot meet with the student within the two week time period, the Director will appoint an impartial individual to meet with the student. The student may opt to wait until the Director can be present. Both the Director (or stand-in) and the student will take notes during this meeting. Before the meeting is concluded, they will compare their notes and clarify any points of misunderstanding. The Director will then have the notes typed within three business days of the meeting. The Director and student will sign the notes indicating their agreement as to the accuracy of the content. In the case of on-line students, notes may be signed and exchanged electronically or via USPS.

If the grievance is not resolved through self-exploration and being counseled by the Director or appointed individual, and another party (or parties) is involved, the other party may be approached with the student's permission. This event will happen within three business days of the acceptance of the notes from the first meeting by both the student and Director, or as soon after those three days that all parties can meet. A three-way conversation will be held in an attempt to find a resolution. The Director or appointed individual may act as a mediator for the two parties involved in the conflict. Notes will be taken, agreed upon, and signed within three business days of this meeting.

Binding mediation may be used if agreed upon by both parties. If the conflict involves an issue of school policy, it shall be addressed to the Director or School Administrator.

If the complaint cannot be resolved after exhausting the institution's grievance procedure, the student may file a complaint with the Arizona State Board for Private Postsecondary Education. The student must contact the State Board for further details. The State Board address is:

Dismissal

The Ealy Center for Natural Healing reserves the right to dismiss any student prior to completion of the program, as determined by the administration, for any of the following reasons:

- Unsatisfactory academic progress
- Unsatisfactory hands-on energy healing skill or performance progress
- Unsatisfactory attendance
- Failure to meet financial agreements
- Failure to abide by The Ealy Center for Natural Healing Code of Ethics
- Acting in a way that, in the judgment of the Director, may be harmful to other students, self, the school, the instructor, or the profession
- Failure to engage in ones personal growth and refusal to seek professional assistance when deemed beneficial by the instructor or Director
- Cheating or stealing in any situation
- Using illegal drugs in any situation
- Using alcohol on campus or attending class or providing a Physiohelanics treatment while under the influence of alcohol
- Attending class or providing a Physiohelanics treatment while under the influence of prescription medications that impair judgment or ability to feel sensation or channel energy without notification of the instructor
- Inability to maintain healthy boundaries around giving and receiving touch

ADMISSIONS

On-line class size is limited to sixteen students. Therefore, only those individuals who demonstrate a deep commitment to discovering and developing their healing gifts and talents will be considered.

Non-discrimination

The Ealy Center for Natural Healing does not discriminate on the basis of age, race, color, gender, sexual orientation, national origin, ethnic origin, religion, marital status, or physical disability.

Admission Requirements

Prospective students must meet the following eligibility requirements:

- Have completed high school or the equivalent; associate degree preferred
- Be 21 years of age or older
- Be able to show proof of their ability to afford tuition and other expenses
- Be committed to fully engaging in the learning process including acquiring the necessary practicum hours
- Have demonstrated a capacity to set a direction and follow through to completion
- Have a commitment to improving the field of energy healing as a profession
- 10 hours documented experience with an energy modality such as but not limited to Physiohelanics, Soul Memory Discovery, yoga, tai chi, Touch-for-Health, Qi Gong, Aikido. (Special arrangements can be made to fulfill this requirement within the first two months of training.)
- Have completed the Field Assessment portion of Soul Memory Discovery. Please contact the Director for details.

Admission Process

To complete the admission file and be considered for a place in the next class, please:

3. Have the following documents sent directly to the Director:
 - a. Two letters of reference specifically attesting to the suitability of the candidate for the training. These references must come from appropriate professionals who are not related to you and must be sent directly from that individual to Dr. Ealy.
 - b. A written personal statement of your reasons for wishing to pursue the certification, a summary of major life issues resolved up to this point, an overview of the personal issues you anticipate resolving during the training, expectations for the training and its effect on your life. It must be printed, double-spaced, three to five pages (750 – 1200 words) in length.

- c. Letters from energy healers (such as Physiohelanics, yoga, tai chi, Touch-for-Health, Qi Gong, Aikido) who have treated you, attesting to your having received the treatments totaling ten hours.
 - d. Letter from a Soul Memory Discovery practitioner attesting to your having completed the Field Assessment.
4. Submit the completed application form and a \$50.00 registration fee.

Applicants will be notified of their status within two weeks of the receipt of their complete application materials at the Center.

In accepting admittance into the Physiohelanics Master Certification Training Program, the student accepts responsibility for her or his own success. Acceptance into the program does not guarantee successful completion of the program.

GENERAL STUDENT INFORMATION

Credit for Previous Study or Life Experience

Because energy healing is taught in a wide variety of ways with no standards of practice or ethics and because Physiohelanics is an energy healing modality that requires specific knowledge and skill, no credit is given for previous energy healing study.

Library

Most learning is the result of self-directed study, teacher-student interaction along with hands-on, experiential learning. The Physiohelanics training manual is used throughout the program. Additional texts are used to expand specific information being studied. A reference library is maintained on-site containing books, CDs, DVDs, audio tapes, professional journals and relevant magazines on energy healing, nutrition, human psychology, communication, and spirituality.

Student Records

Student records are maintained in a locked cabinet on the school premises. These records contain the student's application form, application materials, progress sheet, class papers, and any other relevant materials. The transcript reflects the student's progress as either satisfactory and completed or unsatisfactory and incomplete.

STUDENT ENROLLMENT

Student Enrollment Agreement

Upon acceptance into the Master Practitioner Program, students are required to sign an enrollment agreement outlining the conditions of enrollment, tuition and payment plan, expenses, costs and fees.

Registration Fee

A registration fee of \$50 shall accompany the application.

TUITION

Tuition Amount

Tuition for the Master Practitioner Program is \$7,000.

Payments

- \$1167 is due upon applicant's acceptance into the program and signing of the enrollment agreement. This payment ensures the applicant's place in the class.
- \$1167 is due at the beginning of the first class meeting, April 29, 2009.
- \$2333 is due August 28, 2009.
- \$2333 is due October 30, 2009.

The balance of the tuition, \$5833, may be paid in full at the start of the first class.

Student Loans

The Ealy Center is currently applying for eligibility for Stafford loans. Please contact the Center for updated information.

Late Charges and Costs

An additional \$25 will be charged on payments received later than the due date. The Ealy Center for Natural Healing, LLC shall be entitled to recover reasonable attorney's fees and costs of collection should legal action be necessary to recover amounts owed to the Center by the applicant.

Program Cancellation

In the unlikely event that a certification course is cancelled by The Ealy Center, tuition refunds will be granted in proportion to the classroom hours students have attended.

Refund Policy

Withdrawal notification must be submitted to The Ealy Center for Natural Healing, LLC either in person or by certified mail. Should a student withdraw or be dismissed for any reason, the following refund schedule will apply:

Rejection

An applicant who is rejected by the school is entitled to a refund of all monies paid.

Three-Day Cancellation

The applicant may cancel the enrollment agreement and receive a full refund of all monies paid to date if cancellation is made in writing to Dr. C Diane Ealy, Director, and mailed or delivered to the institution at the address stated herein within three days, excluding Saturday, Sunday, and state and federal holidays, of signing the enrollment agreement. The refund will be made within thirty days after receipt of written notice of cancellation

Other Cancellations

An applicant requesting cancellation more than three days after signing an enrollment agreement and making an initial payment, but prior to entering the school, is entitled to a refund of all tuition monies paid minus an administration fee of \$200.

Refund After the Commencement of Classes

Procedure for Withdrawal

A student choosing to withdraw from the school after the commencement of classes must provide written notice to the Director of the school. This notice must indicate the expected last date of attendance and be signed and dated by the student. For a student who is on authorized Leave of Absence, the withdraw date is the date the student was scheduled to return from the Leave and failed to do so. A student will be determined to be withdrawn from the institution if the student has not attended any class for 4 consecutive class days. All refunds will be issued within 30 days of the determination of the withdrawal date.

Tuition Refunds

Tuition charges will be determined based upon the percentage of the clock hours attempted. The percentage of the clock hours attempted is determined by dividing the total number of clock hours elapsed from the student's start date to the student's last day

of attendance, by the total number of clock hours in the program (less the \$200 administrative fee).

Tuition refunds will be issued within 30 days of the date of student notification, of date of school determination (withdrawn due to absences of other criteria as specified in the school catalog), or in the case of a student not returning from an authorized Leave of Absence (LOA), within 30 days of the date the student was scheduled to return from the LOA and did not return.

Tuition refunds are determined as follows:

- a. Before the beginning of classes, the student is entitled to a refund of 100% of the tuition.
- b. After the commencement of classes, the tuition refund amount shall be determined as follows:

| % of Clock Hours Attempted: | Tuition Refund Amount: |

| 10% or less | At least a 90% refund |
| More than 10% and less than or equal to 20% | At least a 80% refund |
| More than 20% and less than or equal to 30% | At least a 70% refund |
| More than 30% and less than or equal to 40% | At least a 60% refund |
| More than 40% and less than or equal to 50% | At least a 50% refund |
| More than 50% | No Refund is required |

Books and Supplies

There is no refund for equipment, books and supplies received by the student. The student must return the Physiohelanics textbook.

ESTIMATED EXPENSES, COSTS, AND FEES

Textbooks and Supplies

The Physiohelanics Training Manual is included in the fees. Other books will be assigned as appropriate and will cost approximately \$100 for the program. Students will be required to purchase a wood-framed massage table with face cradle within two weeks of their first on-site learning experience. Various sources are available, generally ranging from \$350 to \$500.

Liability Insurance

Students are required to provide proof of their liability insurance by the first class meeting. They can purchase this from an insurance company licensed in the state of Arizona or they can join The Associated Bodywork and Massage Professionals at the student rate of \$65 and receive liability insurance with their membership.

Miscellaneous

Students who have not completed the required ten hours of energy healing treatments and/or Soul Memory Discovery Field Assessment will have additional costs involved in meeting this requirement. Depending upon the modalities and practitioners, these fees may range from \$60 to \$100 per hour.

Travel: Students living outside the Tucson area may incur expenses related to travel, accommodations, and food when meeting the residency requirement.

Late Fee Payment

Students will be charged a \$25 late fee for payments made after the due date. Students will be charged a \$30 fee for checks returned by the bank.
